SCRIP is a powerful program that supports our school with little effort on the part of our parishioners and families. Whether you are shopping for groceries, preparing for that **Super Bowl party** or planning for some home improvement projects SCRIP gift cards are a great option which helps our school at the same time.

How does it work? John and Jane spend an average \$100.00 on groceries for their family each week. Jane goes to the Scrip office after dropping off her children or before picking them up and buys gift cards to use for shopping at Food-4-Less, Fred Meyer, Wal-Mart or Albertson's. Instead of writing the check at the store, the check is written to Sacred Heart—or Jane can use her credit card. Jane receives her gift cards and then heads to the store. Jane also buys her Human Bean or Dutch Bros coffee cards for the week ahead and picks up Kohl's, Macy's and JC Penney gift cards for the family's new clothes. John knows he has a “honey do” list to complete on the weekend, so he purchases cards for Hubbard's Ace Hardware, Lowe's or Home Depot beforehand—now he's ready to purchase all the supplies he needs. The stores give the school a % of card value back. All it take is a little advanced planning.
